# 3. Action Items

## • 3.1 MCSS Council Introductions

Defne Helvacioglu (*President*) welcomed all Council members and invited all to introduce themselves.

• **3.2 SPF Referendum Question Vote** (Informational, Discussion, Vote) Defne Helvacioglu (*President*) presented the SPF referendum question:

*Whereas* MCSS, SSMU, PGSS, and McGill University have made commitments to supporting a culture of sustainability, as exemplified by the co-creation and operation of the Sustainability Projects Fund (SPF) in Winter 2010, which is co-funded by students (50%) and the University (50%) and has funded over 300 projects to date totaling over eleven million dollars,

Whereas the SPF Annual Report is presented each fall semester to the three student societies,

*Whereas* a renewed SPF would continue to be governed by a consensus-based parity governance council (equal numbers of students and staff) and accept project applications from any current MCSS, SSMU, PGSS students, and McGill academic staff and administrative staff,

*Whereas* further information about the SPF is available at <u>www.mcgill.ca/sustainability/spf</u>, including application process and criteria, funded projects, annual reports, and other relevant documentation,

*Whereas* the previous SPF referendum took place in 2017-2018, and passed with the following percentage of students in favor of contributing \$0.55 per credit (up to 15 credits) to the Fund: MCSS (98%), SSMU (89%), and PGSS (74%),

*Whereas* maintaining the fee of \$0.55 per credit (up to 15 credits) will allow the fund to continue operating at its current level of approximately \$1 million per year over the next five years, from 2023 to 2028,

Whereas a "No" result for the MCSS, SSMU, and/or PGSS referendum would abolish the SPF entirely,

*Whereas* McGill University is committed to match the student contribution dollar for dollar – between Fall 2023 and Winter 2028,

Be it resolved that MCSS Council approve the following question for Fall 2022 referendum period:



"Do you agree to renew the non-opt-outable Sustainability Projects Fund (SPF) fee for the next five academic years (Fall 2023 through Winter 2028) at \$0.55 per credit per student per semester (up to 15 credits), payable by all member of the Macdonald Campus Student Society, as matched in equal amount by McGill University?"

A discussion followed: there were a few questions about the history and use of the SPF fund.

Defne Helvacioglu (*President*)moved to adopt the SPF referendum question as presented, Liam Buckley (*VP Sustainability*) seconded. Unanimous, carried.

## • 3.3 MCSS Elections

Cloé Gosselin (*VP Internal*): there was initially a low level of interest to fill the Members at Large and BOC Member positions, so we extended the deadline to Sept 20<sup>th,</sup> at 11am at the Open Students' Society Meeting in the Ceilidh. There. We will close the nominations and present the SPF referendum question to the student body. Election and referendum vote will be from Sept 29 at 9am, to Oct 2 at 11:59pm. on myinvolvement.
